### OPEN FUTURITY

### **\$80,000 Added**

1. To be held in the fall of 2003 in Oklahoma City, OK – State Fair Arena.
2. For three year olds (foals of 2000) – Open to all breeds – Entry must be named at the time of nomination.
3. Entry fee of \$2,000 payable in 10 payments:

The 10 <sup>th</sup> and final payment must be in the office on or before October 1 – <b>not postmarked</b> October 1.		

Sire and Dam Program foals are eligible for the Open Futurity or the Cinch Non Pro Futurity if entered by payment of a \$200 Nomination/Eligibility fee and a \$100 judges fee. Payable as follows: \$100 plus \$100 judges fee by July 1, 2003 and \$100 by October 1, 2003. Sire and Dam Program foal Nomination/Eligibility fees paid after July 1, 2003 until October 1, 2003 will consist of the required \$500 plus a late fee of \$50 per month and the October 1 payment when due. A late fee of \$100 will be assessed after October 1, 2003, in addition to any other applicable fees. After November 1 but by November 15 the Nomination/Eligibility fees, judges fee and late fees, plus a \$250 penalty will apply. After November 15 but by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round, the Nomination/Eligibility fee, judges fee and late fees, plus a \$500 penalty will apply.

There will be 15% deducted from the total entry fees as NRHA retainage.

Note – If you care to send post dated checks for each payment, along with the designated coupons from the payment book you will be furnished after the nomination is received, the checks will be deposited as the payment is due. If at any time you elect to drop your entry, you are required to notify the NRHA office by phone or certified mail and your remaining checks will be returned. Do not, at any time, stop payment on an entry check.

4. Owner and rider must be a member of the NRHA. All riders must have individual memberships. (Refer to the membership requirements in the NRHA Handbook.)

5. There will be no refunds for horses entered but dropped or scratched for any reason.
6. Payment of fees: It is the owner's responsibility to make the payments on or before the due date. NRHA will not be responsible for entries or payments received late. All fees are to be made payable to the National Reining Horse Association (in US Funds) and payments should be sent by guaranteed mail to insure delivery. When payment deadlines fall on Sunday or an official holiday that the US Postal Service is not in operation, postmarks of the next day of operation will be accepted with no late fees. An entry check returned due to insufficient funds will constitute an incomplete entry.
7. Identification of Horses: Physical identification of horses will be made at the exit gate during the first go-round and finals of the Futurity. A photocopy of breed registration papers (for registered horses) or a notarized statement of age and description by a licensed veterinarian and color photographs showing all marks of identification (for non registered horses) must be forwarded to the NRHA office at the time of nomination. These documents will be used for horse identification. Sufficient identification must be furnished prior to final entry payment; failure to do so may cause all fees to be forfeited and the entry disqualified. In the event the registration papers or veterinary statement does not correctly identify the horse, the rider and/or owner will be given 45 days to correct and provide the proper papers to NRHA. Prize monies will be held until proper identification is established to protect the integrity of the NRHA records. A horse is not eligible to participate in the NRHA Futurity if its age, as determined by examination of its teeth, conflicts with the age on the breed registration certificate of registered horses or the notarized statement of age and description required for unregistered horses. Age determination shall be by dental examination in accordance with the official guide for determining the age of the horse as currently published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners.
8. NRHA Competition License: All horses competing in NRHA approved competition will be required to have a competition license. A competition license application **must** accompany the entry nomination if not previously applied for. A photocopy of the breed registration papers must accompany application for registered horses. For non-registered horses, photographs showing full left and right sides and full front and back views, specifically showing all marks of identification, must be submitted with the application. Owners are required to be members of NRHA prior to completing the license process. If current year membership has not been paid, complete a membership application and return it with the competition license application. (Refer to the membership requirements in the NRHA Handbook.)
9. Substitution: If a veterinary certificate (or letter) is received stating why the horse entered will be unable to work, the owner will be allowed to substitute by paying an additional 30% of the entry fee to date, providing the substitute horse is owned by the same person or persons. Ownership will be determined by the rules set forth in the NRHA Handbook. Substitution will be allowed after the final payment by paying 30% of the total entry fee and the required veterinary certificate. Without the veterinary certificate, the horse will be considered a late entry and owe an entry fee of \$4000. There will be no entries accepted after 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round. Substitutions must be completed by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round. No substitution is allowed for Sire and Dam Program entries. All horses involved in substitutions must be licensed prior to completion of substitution process.
10. Late nominations will be accepted using the following nomination/late fee schedule:

Remaining payments will be due on the first of every month thereafter. There will be no entries accepted after 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round. Those entries received after November 1, 2003 will be considered post entries and will be included in a group preceding the regular draw order. This post-entered group will be positioned in order of receipt with the last entry going first.

For horses already nominated, a \$25 Late fee will apply to payments postmarked from the 2<sup>nd</sup> through the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month (with the exception of the final payment – see end of paragraph). A \$50 late fee applies to payments postmarked the 16<sup>th</sup> or after. If two payments are missed, the late fee is \$100 plus the missed payments. If three payments are missed the entry will be dropped, and to re-enter standard penalties will apply. A late fee of \$100 will be assessed those final payments received after October 1, 2003 with no final payments accepted after November 1, 2003. Refer to payment schedule – the final payment must be received in the NRHA office by October 1, 2003. Postmarks will not be considered for the final payment.

11. Change of ownership: An entry may change ownership and retain eligibility under the new owner, provided the National Reining Horse Association office is notified and the new owner keeps up all payments when due. The new owner must be a member of the National Reining Horse Association.
12. Owners may enter more than one horse. A horse may be entered only once per Futurity (Open/Non Pro). Riders may ride three horses.
13. Judging: Due with the July 1 payment will be an additional \$100.00 Judges Fee. There will be five judges placed at different points in the arena: the high score and the low score will be eliminated with only the total of the remaining three scores to be announced. These judges will be selected from the approved NRHA Judges list. **A POST CHECK OR A PRE CHECK AND POST CHECK MAY BE UTILIZED.**
14. Prize money will be paid to the owner of the horse.
15. Riders must be designated no later than **November 1, 2003**. If the proper rider is not designated or not properly designated, NRHA is not responsible for drawing positions closer than the conditions allocate. For the Futurity go rounds, the draw will separate horses with a common rider by at least twenty horses.
16. Entries to this contest are received subject to the right of the NRHA Executive Board to refuse the entry, or the acceptance of a transfer of the entry without notice to the subscriber. Acceptance of the entry is based on the representations made on the entry form. Decisions of the Executive Board will be final. Riders are responsible to know and adhere to eligibility requirements for NRHA events. A rider who enters an event or division in which he/she is ineligible, will forfeit all winnings and entry fees to the NRHA, and be subjected to disciplinary action by the NRHA Board of Directors for unsportsmanlike conduct as set forth in the NRHA Handbook. The rider is responsible for the entry information regardless of whether the form is completed by the agent or owner. The National Reining Horse Association reserves the right to cancel this event without notice at any time prior to the contest without liability to it, but in such event return all entry money to the subscribers. Interest earned on the entries is the property of the National Reining Horse Association.
17. NRHA rules will apply unless specifically deleted or altered.
18. Show management reserves the right to discipline any person that it concludes has abused or permitted abusive behavior against a horse, or, engaged in unsportsmanlike conduct toward show management, judges or exhibitors. Discipline may include official warning, elimination from competition or any other action deemed appropriate by the show management

19. These rules and conditions are subject to change by action of the NRHA Board of Directors.
20. In the event of a tie in the Open, Intermediate Open, or Non Pro divisions following the finals, the following order of tie breaking procedures will apply:
- A runoff.
  - If the exhibitors are still tied, all 5 (five) judges' scores from the runoff will be tallied to determine the winner.
  - If there is still a tie, all 5 (five) judges' scores from the finals will be tallied to determine the winner.
  - If there is still a tie, all 5 (five) judges' scores from the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> go rounds will be tallied to determine the winner.
  - If a tie still exists, the exhibitors will be named co-champions.

In the event of a tie in the Limited Open, Intermediate Non Pro, Limited Non Pro, Prime Time Non Pro, or Gelding divisions, all 5 (five) judges' scores from the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> go rounds will be tallied to determine the winner. If a tie still exists, the exhibitors will be named co-champions.

21. The Futurity shall consist of two go-rounds. Horses not participating in the first go-round of the NRHA Futurity will be considered scratched and ineligible to compete in the second go round.
22. Open Futurity Go Round: All horses will work in the Futurity go rounds to be held immediately before the Futurity, provided the entry meets all prior requirements. The top 30 scoring horses (composite scores from the first and second go round) will advance to the finals. All eligible entries will work in both go rounds with the 30 top scoring horses, including ties, receiving money in each go round as follows:

23. Open Futurity Finals: There will be thirty places paid using the following percentages and guaranteed monies:

The percentages will be figured, using the remaining nomination fees, after go round and guaranteed money has been deducted, plus the added purse. The winners will be determined by the finals score. In the event ties qualify more than thirty horses for the finals, all horses receiving a score in the finals will be paid in decreasing increments of \$250.

In the event that fifteenth place pays less than \$9500, sixteenth through twentieth place will pay in decreasing increments of \$500. Twenty-first through thirtieth place will pay in decreasing increments of \$250. At no time will the purse payout exceed 100%.

## INTERMEDIATE OPEN DIVISION \$15,000 ADDED

1. All Futurity conditions 1 through 21 shall apply. Horses shall enter and pay normal Futurity payments. Entry into this division will be automatic based upon rider eligibility.
2. This division is open to any rider holding a valid NRHA card who is not in the Top 50 money earners in open classes based on open earnings in Category 2 and 6 events for the previous three calendar years. In addition, the Top 25 Non Pro riders based on total earnings in Category 2 and 6 events over the previous three calendar years, are not eligible. For members giving up Non Pro cards please refer to the Non Pro conditions section 9 in the NRHA Handbook. Acceptance of an entry by the NRHA is based upon the representations made on the entry form. The rider shall be held responsible for any and all information on the entry form regardless of who completes said form.
3. Intermediate Open Division purse will have \$15,000 added plus a \$500 division allocation less the 15% NRHA retainage; with 10% going to the first go round, 10% going to the second go round and 80% to the finals. The winner will be determined by the finals score. The purse shall be distributed using the following percentages:

Additional scoring finalists will receive the same payout amount as 25<sup>th</sup> place. At no time will the purse payout exceed 100%.

4. For an Intermediate Open contestant, the score for each go round will count for both the Open and Intermediate Open divisions and separate purses will be paid. All Intermediate Open Division entries will work in both go rounds with the top 25 horses, plus ties, advancing to the finals.
5. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions.

## **LIMITED OPEN DIVISION \$5,000 ADDED**

1. All Futurity conditions 1 through 21 shall apply. Horses shall enter and pay normal Futurity payments. Entry into this division will be automatic based upon rider eligibility.
2. Definition of eligibility for the Limited Open division is as follows: this division is open to any rider holding a valid NRHA card who has earned less than \$15,000 in lifetime NRHA Category 2 and 6 earnings at the start of the NRHA year. For members giving up Non Pro cards please refer to the Non Pro conditions section 9 in the NRHA Handbook. Acceptance of an entry by the NRHA is based upon the representations made on the entry form. The rider shall be held responsible for any and all information on the entry form regardless of who completes said form.
3. The Limited Open division purse will have \$5,000 added plus a \$250 division allocation less the 15% NRHA retainage; with 10% going to the first go round, 10% going to the second go round and 80% paid to the composite according to NRHA payback schedule A percentages. The composite score from the first go round and the second go round will determine the winners.
4. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions.

# **2003 NATIONAL REINING HORSE ASSOCIATION PFIZER/NRHA FUTURITY GELDING INCENTIVE**

## **OPEN FUTURITY \$20,000 ADDED**

1. All Futurity conditions 1 through 21 shall apply. Horses shall enter and pay normal Futurity payments. Any entry wishing to enter the Gelding Incentive Program must indicate so by returning the appropriate coupon and \$100 which must be received in the NRHA office on or before November 1, 2003. After November 1 but by November 15, the \$100 entry fee plus a \$200 penalty will be charged. After November 15 but by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round, the \$100 entry fee plus a \$500 penalty will be charged. Postmarks will not be considered for this entry fee payment.
2. This program is open to any NRHA licensed gelding. Any competition license not indicating gelding must be returned to the NRHA office with the appropriate coupon and \$100 entry fee. Licenses will be stamped "gelding" and returned to the owner at no charge. Acceptance of an entry by the NRHA is based upon the representations made on the entry form. A rider participating in a class or division in which he/she (or the horse he/she is riding) is not eligible will forfeit all winnings and entry fees to the NRHA and be subjected to disciplinary action by the NRHA Board of Directors for unsportsmanlike conduct as set forth in the NRHA Handbook. The rider shall be held responsible for any and all information on the entry form regardless of who completes said form.
3. Any entry wishing to withdraw from the Gelding Incentive will forfeit all fees. There will be no refunds.
4. The Gelding Incentive Open Futurity purse will have \$20,000 added. The entry fees less 15% will be added back. The top 5 geldings will be awarded money regardless of the number of entries in the division. The composite score from the first go round and the second go round will determine the winners. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions. The purse shall be distributed using the following percentages:

1. All Open Futurity conditions 1 through 21 shall apply. The total entry fee is \$2000. Horse shall be entered and pay normal Futurity payments. Any qualifying entry wishing to enter the Cinch Non Pro Futurity must indicate so by returning the appropriate coupon which must be received in the NRHA office on or before November 1, 2003. After November 1, 2003 but by November 15, 2003 the Non Pro coupon plus a penalty of \$250 will apply and the entry will be included in a group preceding the regular draw order. Postmarks will not be considered. After November 15 but by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round the Non Pro coupon plus a \$500 penalty will apply.

Sire and Dam Program foals are eligible for the Cinch Non Pro Futurity if entered by payment of a \$500 Nomination/Eligibility Fee and a \$100 judges fee. Payable as follows: \$250 plus \$100 judges fee by July 1, 2003 and \$250 by October 1, 2003. Sire and Dam Program foal Nomination/Eligibility fees paid after July 1, 2003 until October 1, 2003 will consist of the required \$500 plus a late fee of \$50 per month and the October 1 payment when due. A late fee of \$100 will be assessed after October 1, 2003 in addition to other applicable fees. After November 1 but by November 15 the Nomination/Eligibility fee plus a \$250 penalty will apply. After November 15 but by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round, the Nomination/Eligibility fee plus a \$500 penalty will apply.

2. Any entry wishing to withdraw from the Cinch Non Pro Futurity, but show in the Open Futurity, may do so by paying one \$500 penalty prior to 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round and will then be within a group to run prior to the regular drawn horses. There will be no refunds.
3. Non Pro entries must qualify under the Non Pro definition and Non Pro ownership definition as stated in the 2003 NRHA Handbook. All riders are responsible to know and adhere to eligibility requirements for NRHA events. Acceptance of the entry by NRHA is based upon the representation made on the entry form. The rider shall be held responsible for the information contained on the entry form regardless of who completes said form.
4. The Cinch Non Pro Futurity purse will have \$50,000 added; the entry fees, less 15% will be added back; with 5% going to the first go round, 5% to the second go round, and 90% to the finals. The top 25 horses plus ties will advance to the finals. The winner will be determined by the finals score. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions. The purse shall be distributed using the following percentages:

The Intermediate Non Pro division purse will have \$15,000 added, plus a \$500 division allocation less the 15% retainage; with 5% going to the first go round, 5% going to the second go round, and 90% will be paid to the composite according to the following payback percentages. The Limited Non Pro division purse will have \$5,000 added, plus a \$250 division allocation less the 15% retainage; with 5% going to the first go round, 5% going to the second go round, and 90% will be paid to the composite according to the following payback percentages. Of the \$2000 entry fee, \$1250 will go toward the Non Pro purse, \$500 will go toward the Intermediate Non Pro purse for each eligible entry, and \$250 will go toward the Limited Non Pro purse for each eligible entry. **Intermediate Non Pro and Limited Non Pro entry will be automatic** and the composite score from the first go round and the second go round will determine the winners. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions. **Definition of eligibility for the Intermediate Non Pro Division is as follows:** open to any rider holding a valid NRHA Non Pro card who is not in the Top 25 money earners based on total earnings in NRHA Category 2 and 6 events over the previous three calendar years. **Definition of eligibility for the Limited Non Pro Division is as follows:** open to any rider holding a valid NRHA Non Pro card who has earned less than \$7500 in lifetime NRHA Category 2 and 6 earnings at the start of the NRHA year.

## **PRIME TIME NON PRO DIVISION \$5,000 ADDED**

1. All Open Futurity conditions 1 through 21 shall apply as well as the Cinch Non Pro Futurity conditions 1 through 3.
2. Any Non Pro 45 years of age or older as of January 1, 2003, wishing to enter the Prime Time Non Pro Division must also be entered into the Cinch Non Pro Futurity. Entry will be automatic based on eligibility. Notification of birthdate is required by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the beginning of the show.
3. Any entry that withdraws from the Cinch Non Pro Futurity and shows in the Open Futurity is no longer eligible for the Prime Time Non Pro Division.
4. Scores will be determined using a handicap system. Non Pro exhibitors will have 0 points per judge added to their final score, Intermediate Non Pro exhibitors will have \_ point per judge added to their final score and Limited Non Pro exhibitors will have 1 point per judge added to their final score.
5. The Prime Time Non Pro Division will have \$5,000 added with 5% paid in the first go round, 5% paid in the second go round and 90% to the composite. The composite score of the first and second go will determine the winner. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions. The purse shall be distributed using the NRHA Handbook payback percentages based on the number of horses entered.

# **2003 NATIONAL REINING HORSE ASSOCIATION PFIZER/NRHA FUTURITY GELDING INCENTIVE**

## **NON PRO FUTURITY \$10,000 ADDED**

1. Non Pro Futurity conditions 1 through 3 shall apply. Horses shall enter and pay normal Futurity payments. Any entry wishing to enter the Gelding Incentive Program must indicate so by returning the appropriate coupon and \$100 which must be received in the NRHA office on or before November 1, 2003. After November 1 but by November 15, the \$100 entry fee plus a \$200 penalty will be charged. After November 15 but by 5:00 p.m. two days prior to the first go round, the \$100 entry fee plus a \$500 penalty will be charged. Postmarks will not be considered for this entry fee payment.
2. This program is open to any NRHA licensed gelding. Any competition license not indicating gelding must be returned to the NRHA office with the appropriate coupon and \$100 entry fee payment. License will be stamped "gelding" and returned to the owner at no charge. Acceptance of an entry by the NRHA is based upon the representations made on the entry form. A rider participating in a class or division in which he/she (or the horse he/she is riding) is not eligible will forfeit all winnings and entry fees to the NRHA and be subjected to disciplinary action by the NRHA Board of Directors for unsportsmanlike conduct as set forth in the NRHA Handbook. The rider shall be held responsible for any and all information on the entry form regardless of who completes said form.
3. Any entry wishing to withdraw from the Gelding Incentive will forfeit all fees. There will be no refunds.
4. The Gelding Incentive Non Pro Futurity purse will have \$10,000 added. The entry fees, less 15% will be added back. The top 5 geldings will be awarded money regardless of the number of entries in the division. The composite score from the first go round and the second go round will determine the winners. In the event there is a tie for first place, please see item #20 under General Futurity Conditions. The purse shall be distributed using the following percentages:
  1. 50%
  2. 25%
  3. 12.5%
  4. 7.5%
  5. 5%
